

Pupil Premium Report

September 2016

During the academic year, September 15 – July 16, Southwick School received an allocated budget of £43,465 pupil premium funding, used to support the learning of vulnerable/disadvantaged learners, which was supplemented with additional money from the school budget. This money was used to provide:

- one-to-one tuition;
- the support of a Learning Mentor;
- an additional teacher for four afternoons per week to accelerate the learning of a number of our pupils;
- additional teaching assistant hours to support learning for pupils in KS1 and KS1;
- purchase of additional resources and equipment;
- a parent support advisor;
- attendance at the Poplar Club (Wrap-around Care);
- extra-curricular activities.

The impact of this provision was very positive. In 2015-16, the children entitled to Pupil Premium funding made expected or better progress in their journey from KS1 to KS2.

Ofsted commented in their report of December 14 that 'The gaps in the attainment of disadvantaged pupils compared to other pupils are closing'.

For the academic year 2016-2017 the school will receive funding of £46,020.
