


Sounds-Write – A Guide for Parents

Being able to read is the most important skill children learn during their early schooling and has far-reaching implications for life-long learning, confidence and well-being. High quality phonic teaching is the prime means by which we teach children how to read and spell words.

At Southwick School, we follow the 'Sounds-Write' phonics programme and this guide is designed to help you, as parents or carers, to understand 'Sounds-Write' so that you can support your child at home.

The key knowledge and skills that the 'Sounds-Write' programme develops are;



Skills

1. Blending – the ability to push sounds together to build words.

Example:
$$/k//a//t/ \rightarrow cat$$

2. Segmenting – the ability to pull apart the individual sounds in words.

Example:
$$pig \rightarrow |p| / |i| / |g|$$

Phoneme manipulation – the ability to insert sounds into and delete sounds out of words.

This skill is necessary to test out alternatives for spellings that represent more than one sound.

Ex: spelling $< \underline{o} >$.

Is it /o/ as in hot, /oe/ as in no, or /u/ as in son?
