

Pupil Premium Report

September 2014

During the academic year, September 13 – July 14, Southwick School received an allocated budget of £30,950 pupil premium funding, used to support the learning of vulnerable learners, which was supplemented with additional money from the school budget. This money was used to provide:

- one-to-one tuition;
- the support of a Learning Mentor;
- the appointment of an additional teacher for four afternoons per week to accelerate the learning of a number of our pupils.
- an additional teaching assistant to work alongside pupils in KS1.

The impact of this provision was very positive. In schools, children's academic progress is measured from Y2 using points. A point score greater than 4 is considered to be outstanding and a score of 3.45 – 4 is seen as good.

The average point score gains for pupils entitled to pupil premium (children who have been entitled to free school meals during any period during their time at primary school and forces children) for 2012-2013 is as follows:

Maths 4.36 Outstanding progress

Reading 3.18 Satisfactory progress

Writing 3.63 Good Progress

All children who attracted Pupil Premium funding during 2013-14 made at least the expected progress from KS1 to KS2 in both English and Maths.

For the academic year 2014-2015 we will receive £41,100.
