Pupil Premium Report

September 2013

Southwick School received an allocated budget of £9420 pupil premium funding September 2012 – April 2013 which was supplemented with additional money from the school budget. This money was used to provide:

- one-to-one tuition;
- the support of a Learning Mentor;
- the appointment of an additional teacher for two mornings per week to accelerate the learning of some of our KS2 pupils.
- a teaching assistant with experience in inclusion in EYFS to work alongside pupils in EYFS and in KS1.
- a six week programme, 'Learning Champs' where Phil Wylie, a PE specialist, worked with a group of Y5/6 children and their parents, supported by two TAs.

The impact of this provision was very positive. In schools, children's academic progress is measured from Y2 using points. A point score greater than 4 is considered to be outstanding and a score of 3.45 – 4 is seen as good.

The average point score gains for pupils entitled to pupil premium (children who have been entitled to free school meals during any period during their time at primary school and forces children) for 2012-2013 is as follows:

Reading 4.8 Outstanding progress

Writing 3.6 Good progress

Maths 3.7 Good Progress
